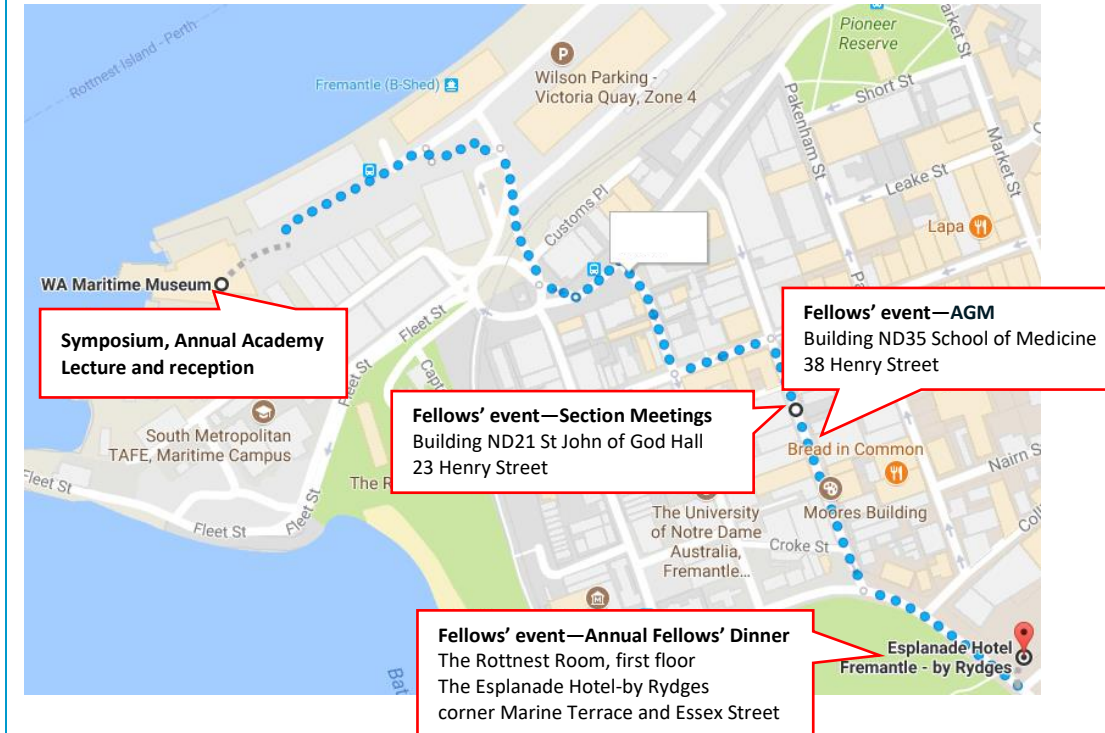

### Getting there

WA Maritime Museum is a 15-minute walk from The Esplanade Hotel—by Rydges.

30-minutes by car from Perth city.

45-minutes by car from Perth airport.

**Parking:** City of Fremantle car park at the WA Maritime Museum, at an hourly rate.

**Fremantle public transport:** The Fremantle CAT (Central Area Transit) is a free bus service that operates around Fremantle's central business district. The blue CAT services depart every 10 minutes and the red CAT services depart every 15 minutes.
